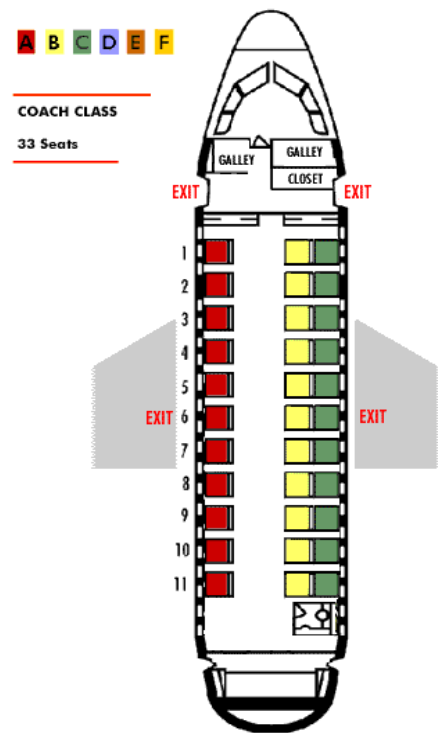

Saab aircraft are parked on the ramp outside of gates A19 and gate A33

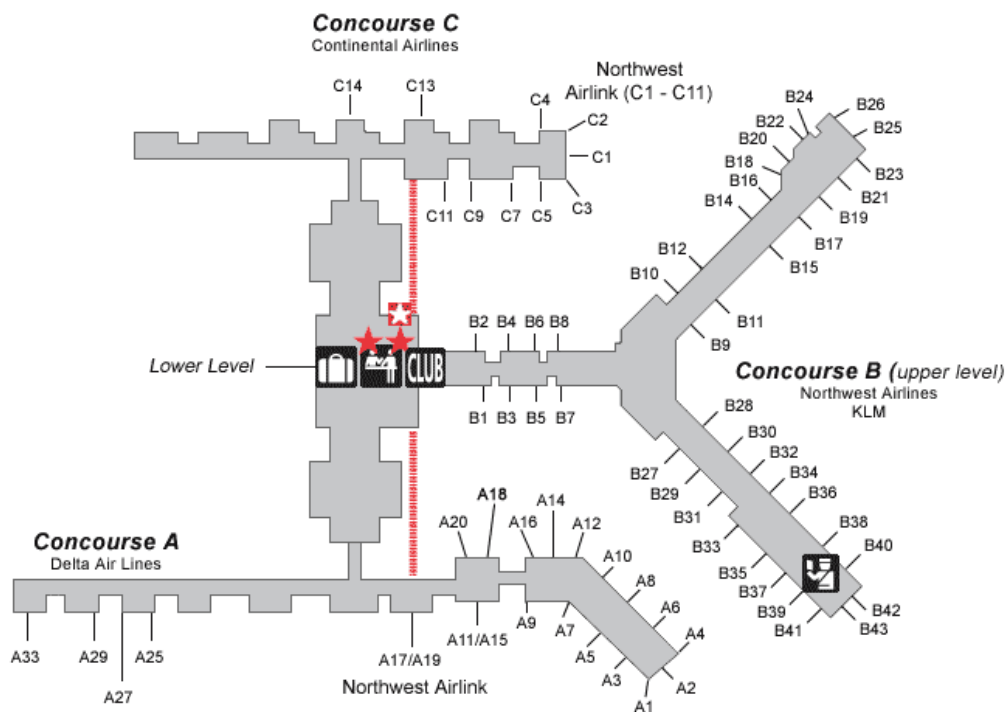


Planeside checked bags are delivered once you step off the plane
